Lighting Up Schools From The Past

Dear Parents / Carers,

Here is an outline plan for our curriculum for the second half of the Spring Term. We will have a cross-curricular approach to cover a range of Science, Geography and History objectives. As part of our work this half term we will be going on a school visit to York Castle Museum. Here we will experience what life was like in a Victorian school. The children will become architects, inventors and more this half term as they design their own Victorian school.

Literacy:

Non-chronological reports - Based on the life of Thomas Eddison, (Science.)

Traditional tales - Oliver Twist. Chn to use the classic ideas from the novel and write the 'next chapter;' telling the story of what happened to Oliver when he went to a school.

Poems to perform - The teacher at the new Victorian school is teaching the children the Owl and the Pussycat and then the children have to create their own rhyming poems with actions.

Numeracy:

Length and Perimeter - Mr Brownlow is investing his fortune in building a new school for Oliver and his friends. As architects, the children have to design this new Victorian school using what they learn about length and permimeter.

Fractions.

Science and DT:

Light - The headteacher has decided that oil lights are no good for his new, Victorian school. The children must design and then create their own electrical lights to go in it.

Art: Weaving - In their Victorian school day, the children have a weaving lesson. They must use wool to design and create a woven pattern.

Geography: - Similiarities and differences between rural and city life, (including schooling) in Victorian Britain.

History: - Chn will use their first hand experience from York Castle Museum and secondary sources to research what life was like for children in Victorian Britain.

R.E: - The Easter Story during Victorian Britain. Painting eggs for Easter.

Computing: - Scratch

Music: - Notation and composition. Tuned instruments.

French: - Fruit, likes and dislikes and writing instructions.

PE: - Outdoor Education and Box2bfit.
